**Positive Education**

As a part of our Positive Education initiatives, this term we are focussing on Kindness and the behaviours and thinking that we can develop to show kindness to others. When we are kind and do thinks for others, it builds our positive emotions, builds our relationships with others and makes everyone feel better about themselves. Our Care Groups are going to focus on doing 'Random Acts of Kindness', both within the school and across the wider community this term. Each week we focus on a targeted behaviour that we will explicitly teach in our classrooms, model for our students and expect to see across our school community. These focus behaviours are:

Week 1	Care for and always be kind to others
Week 2	We respect others and their games
Week 3	We care by including others
Week 4	Be mindful of others
Week 5	We use manners at all times
Week 6	Look after each other
Week 7	Have a growth mindset
Week 8	Accept challenges and learn from mistakes
Week 9	Build our resilience skills by bouncing back
Week 10	Use mistakes as an opportunity to learn

Parents are encouraged to discuss these behaviours at home with their children, talk about what this means at home and at school, model these behaviours and help your child develop these skills.

Our Level 4 students are those that consistently behave and work at the standard that we expect, setting positive examples for others and being the best that they can be. 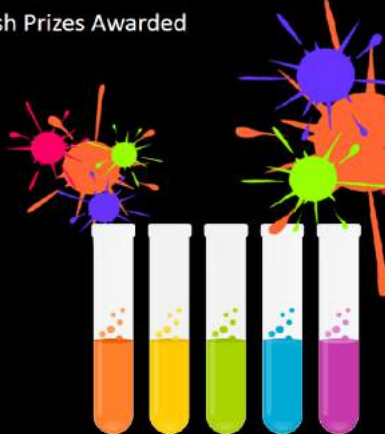
