**NEW BUILDING ARRIVES!**

There was much excitement in the school last Thursday with the arrival of our new school building. Amazingly in 3 short hours we went from having an empty space to an almost completed building. A huge crane that was visible from all over Clare lifted the four separate parts of the building into place watched by a crowd of amazed students. Workers have completed the outside of the building making it weather tight this week with painting and carpeting to be completed by the end of this week. It will then have a veranda, deck, ramp and steps added to the front of the building and a concrete path added all the way around. Once air conditioning and power is connected, the two year 4/5 classes will be able to move in, allowing them to work collaboratively next to each other. We expect that this will be early next term.

With the arrival of the new building it creates two spare classrooms in our school. The single room that Mr Higgins currently occupies will be redeveloped into a (STEM Building) Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths facility and the spare room in the triple block will be kept as a multipurpose room.

Further development has taken place this week to the outdoor play area for our Junior Primary Students with the arrival of new imaginative play equipment. A Play café, mud kitchen and performing arts theatre were all built from recycled pallets from 'Made with Grace' in Gladstone. These items will encourage creative play in this area and compliment the sandpit and cubby that are already there.



## REPORTS

Teachers are busy finalising midyear reports and these will be sent home next week. Midyear reports are an important aspect of our reporting process and allow teachers to highlight the area of improvement children have made, their current work habits and areas to improve on in the second part of the year. While we all want our students doing well working at the expected level or above, please also focus on the effort that your child is showing in each subject. As we build our Growth Mindsets, we want to reinforce with the students that the more effort we give to our learning, the more successful we will be and that we must keep persevering, even with tasks that we find difficult. If your child is not giving their best efforts to their learning, they can't expect to be as successful as possible. Please talk about this with your child. In Department for Education reporting guidelines, Satisfactory Achievement means the student is working at the level they should be for their age. Partial achievement means they are working towards this level and we will be supporting your child in a variety of ways to help them get to their level. If you have any questions or concerns once you receive your child's report, please make an appointment with your child's teacher to discuss their learning progress.

## LEVEL 4 STUDENTS REWARD

Next Friday 6<sup>th</sup> July I will be cooking a BBQ lunch for all our Level 4 students, those students whose behaviour, attitude and effort in class has been consistently at a very high standard for an ongoing period of time. The Level 4 students will then have the courts area for a free play at lunchtime as a reward for their reaching our highest behavioural expectation. If your child is in the primary classes, ask what level they are at and why. If they are not at Level 4, work with them to identify what they can do to reach Level 4 next term. Congratulations to all our Level 4 students – keep up the wonderful effort!

## SAFETY WALKING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

I was contacted earlier this week by a concerned motorist who almost hit some of our students as they crossed the road at Powell Street without looking for traffic. Please remind your child about road safety, the importance of being aware of traffic and the possible consequences. It is great that we have so many children who walk to and from school but I would hate for an injury or worse to occur.

Last week Governing Council approved our final Pupil Free Day for 2018. This will be on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> August when our staff will join with staff from Auburn and Watervale to improve our learning. Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> September will be a School Closure Day, in line with Clare High School. On this day no staff will be onsite. OSHC will operate for both of these days offering whole day care.


